She is a member of numerous NGOs board of directors in her native El Salvador focused on education and the environment and also in the USA focusing in education and the protection of human rights. She has been published in El Salvador with regards to her experience in the USA/Mexico border during the 2014 unaccompanied minor crisis and her experiences on consular work in the USA for academic purposes.
